Burn Ban: Establishment

- Background
- Creates a county "Burn Ban" Ordinance
- Automatic Activation Upon Keetch Byram
 Drought Index (KBDI) Reaches 500
- Consistent with neighboring Counties (Brevard, Lake, Seminole, and Osceola)
- Automatically Deactivates when KBDI is Below 500 for 7 Consecutive Days
- Provides for public notice, enforcement, penalties.



Burn Ban: Required Notice (1 of 2)

■ Enforcement of Burn Ban does not take effect until Required Notice is given to the public.

Upon activation and deactivation of a Burn Ban, Fire Rescue shall immediately notify the Communications Division.



Burn Ban: Required Notice (2 of 2)

- The Communications Division shall then use the following resources to notify the public:
 - Press releases through broadcast media, radio, and local television network, and posted on the County's website.
 - Orange TV
 - Utilize all County social media platforms
 - Admin. Regulation for Citizen Communication (5.02.02)



Burn Ban: Enforcement; Penalties

Neighboring Counties:

County	Penalty
Brevard County	Code Enforcement Action; and/or fine not to exceed \$500.00 and up to 60 days in jail or both.
Lake County	Code Enforcement Action; and/or "any applicable costs" involved in extinguishing the fires, with a minimum cost of one hundred and fifty dollars per incident.
Osceola County	Code Enforcement Action; and/or maximum civil penalty of \$500.00 per violation.
Seminole County	Code Enforcement Action; and/or fine not to exceed \$500.00 and up to 60 days in jail or both.

Our Proposed:

	Code Enforcement Action ("irreparable/irreversible" if
Orange County	extinguishing of fires necessary); and/or maximum civil
	penalty of \$500.00 per violation.
