AN **ORDINANCE** TO PERTAINING FIREARM PURCHASES IN ORANGE COUNTY, 6 FLORIDA; CREATING SECTIONS 26-91 THROUGH 26-99; **PROVIDING A TITLE FOR THE DIVISION; PROVIDING** 8 **AUTHORITY** AND **PURPOSE;** SPECIFYING JURISDICTION; PROVIDING FOR CONSTRUCTION; 10 PROVIDING **DEFINITIONS;** PROVIDING FOR A WAITING PERIOD AND CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECK; 12 PROVIDING EXEMPTIONS FROM THE WAITING PERIOD; PROVIDING FOR INSPECTION OF RECORDS 14 **OF FIREARM SALES: PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES:** AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 16

WHEREAS, in 2011 the Florida Legislature amended section 790.33, Florida Statutes,

to preempt the regulation of firearms, ammunition and components thereof; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the draconian penalties aimed at elected officials to deter

- 20 violation of the preemption and rights related to firearms, the Board amended/repealed firearm related provisions in several sections of the Orange County Code, including sections 26-91
- through 26-98 ("The Handgun Ordinance") which contained a 3-day waiting period for the purchase of a handgun; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Art. VIII, Sec. 5(b), Florida Constitution, provides counties with the authority to require a criminal history records check and waiting period in connection with the
- 26 purchase of any firearm occurring within such county; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this ordinance to enact requirements connected with thepurchase of any firearm consistent with Art. VIII, Sec. 5(b), Florida Constitution.

62 The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Firearm means any weapon, including a starter gun or handgun, which will or is designed to or may readily be converted

68	to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; any firearm muffler or firearm
70	silencer; any destructive device; or any machine gun. The term "firearm" does not include an antique firearm as defined in section
72	790.001, Florida Statutes.
74	Property to which the public has a right of access means any real or personal property to which the public has a right of
76	access, including property owned by either public or private individuals, firms and entities and expressly includes flea markets,
78	gun shows and firearms exhibitions.
80	Sale shall mean the transfer of money or other valuable consideration for any firearm when any part of the transaction is
82	conducted on property to which the public has the right of access. For purposes of the foregoing, private residences shall be deemed
84	property to which the public does not have the right of access.
86	Sec. 26-96. Waiting period; criminal history background check.
88	(a) No firearm shall be delivered to any person for a
90	period of three (3) working days after the sale of such firearm.
92	(b) No person shall deliver a firearm to another person to consummate a sale when the transaction is subject to the waiting
94	period in subsection (a) until the seller has complied with all of the provisions set forth in section 790.065, Florida Statutes, requiring a
96	criminal history check of the potential buyer.
98	Sec. 26-97. Exemptions from waiting period.
100	The following shall be exempt from the waiting period set forth in Section 26-96 above.

104	(1) Individuals who are licensed to carry concealed firearms under the provisions of section 790.06, Florida Statutes, or who are licensed to carry concealed firearms under any other
106	provision of state law and who show a valid license.
108	(2) A law enforcement or correctional officer as defined in section 943.10, Florida Statutes.
110	(3) A law enforcement agency as defined in section 934.02, Florida Statutes.
