Ordinance for Firearms 3-Day Waiting Period

I. EXPLANATION & SUMMARY:

In 2011, the Florida Legislature amended section 790.33, Florida Statutes, to preempt the regulation of firearms, ammunition and components thereof. As a result of the harsh penalties aimed at elected officials to deter violation of the preemption and rights related to firearms, the Board repealed firearm related provisions in several sections of the Orange County Code. Among those repealed were sections 26-91 through 26-98 of the Code ("The Handgun Ordinance") which contained a three-day waiting period and criminal background check in connection with the purchase of a handgun.

The proposed ordinance reinstates the three-day waiting period, criminal background check and enacts requirements connected with the purchase of any firearm consistent with Article VIII, Section 5(b) of the Florida Constitution.

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WHEREAS, in 2011 the Florida Legislature amended section 790.33, Florida Statutes, to preempt the regulation of firearms, ammunition and components thereof; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the draconian penalties aimed at elected officials to deter violation of the preemption and rights related to firearms, the Board amended/repealed firearm related provisions in several sections of the Orange County Code, including sections 26-91 through 26-98 ("The Handgun Ordinance") which contained a 3-day waiting period for the purchase of a handgun; and

WHEREAS, Art. VIII, Sec. 5(b), Florida Constitution, provides counties with the authority to require a criminal history records check and waiting period in connection with the purchase of any firearm occurring within such county; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this ordinance to enact requirements connected with the purchase of any firearm consistent with Art. VIII, Sec. 5(b), Florida Constitution.

FIREARM PURCHASE WAITING PERIOD

Sec. 26-91. Title.

This division may be cited as "The Firearm Ordinance."

Sec. 26-92. Authority and purpose.

This division is enacted pursuant to the home rule powers granted to the county pursuant to Article VIII, Section 1(g) and Article VIII, Section 5 of the Florida Constitution, subsection 125.01(1)(t), Florida Statutes, and Article I, Section 103, Orange County Charter, to provide a waiting period between the purchase and delivery of firearms in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the county.

Sec. 26-93. Jurisdiction.

This division shall be effective in the incorporated and unincorporated areas of the county.

Sec. 26-94. Construction.

The provisions of this division shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes of this division.

Sec. 26-95. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Firearm means any weapon, including a starter gun or handgun, which will or is designed to or may readily be converted

to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; any destructive device; or any machine gun. The term "firearm" does not include an antique firearm as defined in section 790.001, Florida Statutes.

Property to which the public has a right of access means any real or personal property to which the public has a right of access, including property owned by either public or private individuals, firms and entities and expressly includes flea markets, gun shows and firearms exhibitions.

Sale shall mean the transfer of money or other valuable consideration for any firearm when any part of the transaction is conducted on property to which the public has the right of access. For purposes of the foregoing, private residences shall be deemed property to which the public does not have the right of access.

Sec. 26-96. Waiting period; criminal history background check.

- (a) No firearm shall be delivered to any person for a period of three (3) working days after the sale of such firearm.
- (b) No person shall deliver a firearm to another person to consummate a sale when the transaction is subject to the waiting period in subsection (a) until the seller has complied with all of the provisions set forth in section 790.065, Florida Statutes, requiring a criminal history check of the potential buyer.

Sec. 26-97. Exemptions from waiting period.

The following shall be exempt from the waiting period set forth in Section 26-96 above.

- (1) Individuals who are licensed to carry concealed firearms under the provisions of section 790.06, Florida Statutes, or who are licensed to carry concealed firearms under any other provision of state law and who show a valid license.
- (2) A law enforcement or correctional officer as defined in section 943.10, Florida Statutes.
- (3) A law enforcement agency as defined in section 934.02, Florida Statutes.
