### Process

- Requires Site Visit after application
- Scoring according to matrix:
  - Concept (Need, Vision, Inspiring Excellence)
  - Facility (Process/Design/Planning, Quality)
  - Management & Budget (Readiness, Stewardship)
- Minimum scoring threshold to be eligible

#### Construction



- Multiphase project will result in an iconic, world-class museum in downtown Orlando: A center for light, change, inspiration, courage and hope.
- Built on the site of the former Orlando Regional Chamber of Commerce and adjacent Senator Beth Johnson Park.

## Orlando Ballet Loch Haven Dance Center Construction


#### Construction



- Project focused on Great Hall, a 9,386square-feet performance auditorium that also can be used as two separate rehearsal studios plus adjacent public spaces.
- Demolish existing structure and construct state-of-the-art, energy-efficient structure.
- Multiphase project built on the site of the Loch Haven Neighborhood Center, a City of Orlando-owned facility.

TDT Funds \$500,000 Total Project Cost \$2,155,840







### Orlando Science Center Orlando Science Center Visitor Experience Renovation Project




#### Renovation

- Renovate restrooms on second, third and fourth floor and replace carpeting in second- and fourth-floor rotunda.




