   8 Hurricanes (Predicted 5-9)
- 2 Major Hurricanes (Predicted 1-4)
- Notable Events Florence & Michael
  - Orange County resources sent to NC and NFL



## **Looking Back - Irma**

- EOC level 1 activation 6-days
- High TS sustained w/Hurricane gusts
- 22 shelters opened 4,391
- 7 Sandbag distribution sites 123,000
- 311 Calls received 64,106
- Up to 9 days power outages

- Damage Assessment \$44,428,456
- Major flooding Westside Manor (151)
- New Law Emergency Power Plan
- Long Term Recovery Group



- Disaster Supply Kit
  - Water, Food, Meds, Cash,
     Flashlight/Batteries, Important
     Papers



Stay Informed
 – Radio, Local Media, 311, Apps



#### Prepare Home

- Trim Trees
- Clean up yard debris
- Protect windows
- Designate safe room

#### Insurance

- Home policy
- Rental personal property
- Flood insurance



# **Evacuation/Shelter Tips**

Inland county typically does not evacuate, however .....

Evacuate residents in:

- Flood prone, or low lying areas
- Manufactured/Mobile homes or RV parks
- Evacuation centers:
  - General
  - Pet Friendly
  - People Special Needs
