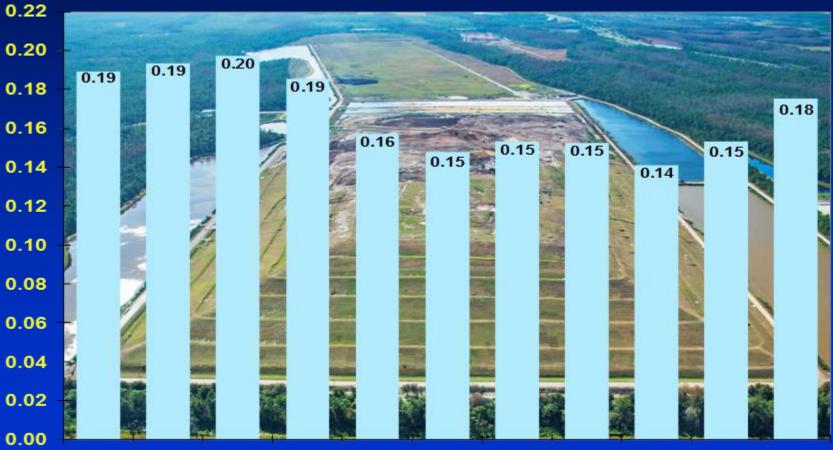
FTEs per 1,000 Water & Wastewater Customers

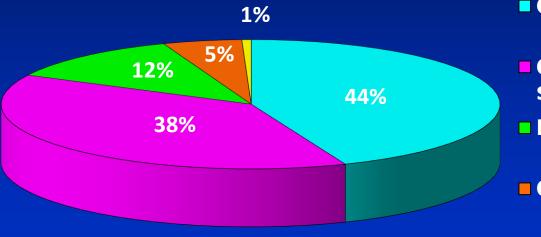
FTEs per 1,000 Tons of Solid Waste per Day

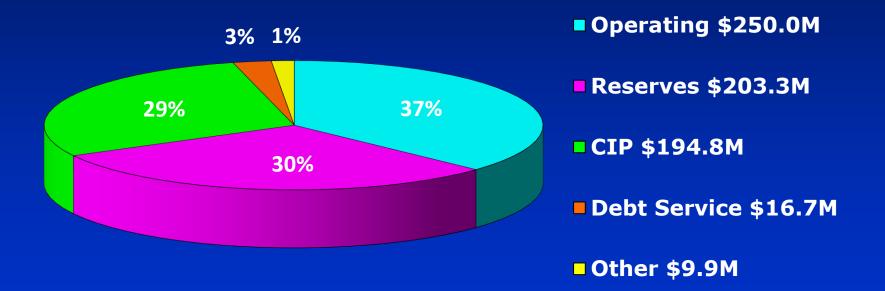

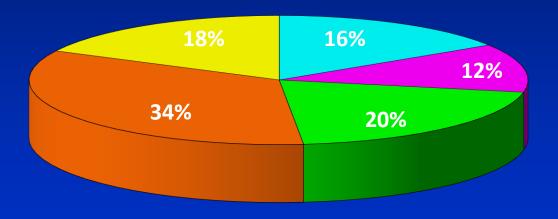

Water & Wastewater System CIP Funding

- Potential new bond issue

- Budgeted at \$80.0M
- May be needed toward the end of FY 2020 depending on CIP spending
- Collaborate with Fiscal & Business Services and the Comptroller's Office to determine the optimal timing and sizing of a debt issue





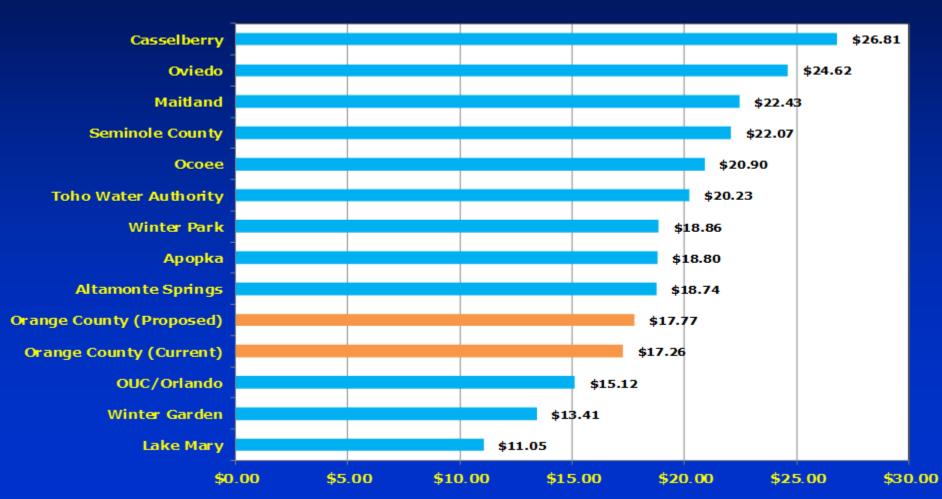


- 3% Rate Increase for Water & Wastewater System Rates

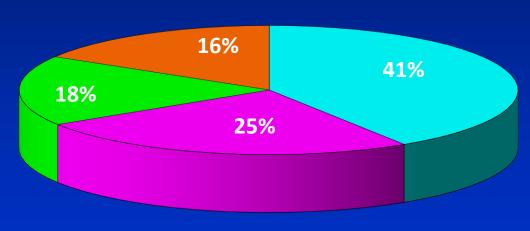




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Utilities CIP Funding by Source Total Utilities CIP Budget \$194.8M



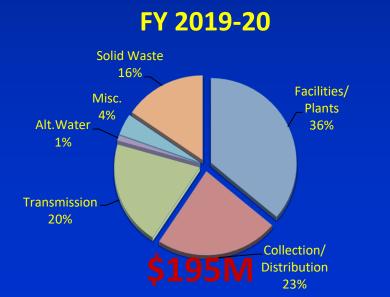

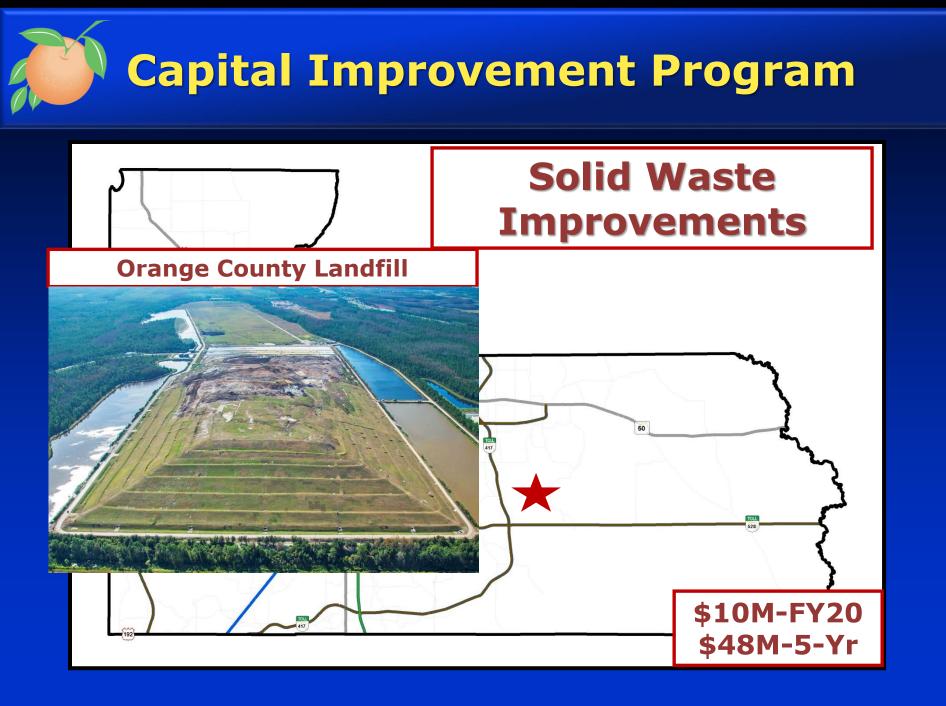














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Proposed FY 2019-20 Budget Reflects:
