 Cooperative Extension received almost 18,000 volunteer hours valued over \$400K









- The Veterans' Service Program provided almost \$23M in assistance to Veterans
- The Crisis Assistance Program have served 1,800 citizens and provided almost \$1M dollars in financial assistance









- Head Start had over 44 fathers graduated from the 24/7 Dads curriculum
- Head Start had over 350 participants in Guest Readers Week
