Florida Department of Health Child Care Food Program Budget

For Sponsors of Affiliated Sites

The Head Start Division requests Board approval of the Florida Department of Health Child Care Food Program Budget for Sponsors of Affiliated Sites; Supplemental Budget for Special Cost Items; Management Plan; and Delegation of Signing Authority for the Child Care Food Program.

The Child Care Food Program is a part of the National School Lunch Program, which provides children in public and private schools with balanced meals and snacks to meet the USDA minimum daily nutritional requirements. All grantees must utilize USDA funds as primary payment for meals, as mandated by Head Start Child Nutrition Performance Standard §1304.44 (a)(b). The Florida Department of Health. will reimburse Orange County, the Head Start non-federal entity, up to an estimated amount of \$2,063,099 for meals served to eligible children enrolled in the Head Start Program. The term of this program is from October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

Orange County Head Start Policy Council Meeting: November 21, 2019 Director's Program Information Update

Orange County Head Start Division Administration Updates

- The Office of Head Start (OHS) issued an IM (ACF-IM-HS-19-03) on September 30, 2019 regarding Kinship Care, Eligibility, Homelessness, Economic hardship relative, Foster Care, Child Welfare partnerships. The IM was issued due to the number of questions from grantees that want to enroll children living in kinship care and are concerned about the eligibility of these children. Formal or informal kinship care, for the purposes of this IM, broadly refers to children who are living with relatives or caregivers other than their parents. In most cases, these children are eligible for Head Start services according to the Head Start Act and Head Start Program Performance Standards (HSPPS) and programs can enroll them.
- The Office of Head Start released a Ylog on how the OHS is addressing the opioid crisis and other substance use disorders. In this video, Dr. Bergenon shares some of the creative approaches Head Start programs have taken to support children who are affected by substance abuse, including wrap-around care and supports to grandparents who are raising their grandchildren. She also discusses the regional meetings on opioids and highlights the relationships established with the medical community.
- Florida Head Start Association (FHSA) announced seven of the 2020 FHSA Annual Award recipients received region recognition from the Region IV Head Start Association (RIVHSA). State award winners were honored during the FHSA Annual Awards Luncheon in Daytona Beach, FL, on October 11, 2019. The FHSA Annual Awards promote excellence in the Head Start/Early Head Start community through recognition of employers, parents, alumni, volunteers and partners who have made extraordinary contributions to their programs and exemplify the highest quality of standards in their communities. The state winners advanced as Region finalists in their categories. Four FHSA State award recipients will be recognized at the RIVHSA 2020 Awards gala on February 20, 2020, in Atlanta, GA.

OCHS was contacted by the research team at NORC at the University of Chicago to participate in the web-based survey. This national survey collects information from the Head Start director. The goal is to learn about grantees' use of, need for, and experiences with T/TA. The information will

help the Administration for Children and Families and OHS strengthen its T/TA system to better meet programs' needs

Early Childhood Development & Education

- Orange County Head Start Education staff celebrated "Bring a Principal to Head Start" month. "Bring a Principal to Your Head Start" is an opportunity for Head Start programs to establish relationships with the principals of the feeder schools. The meeting with the Principal should encourage collaborations with elementary schools to ensure the lifelong success of our Head Start graduates
- The education team prepared to relocate to the Lila Mitchell center to Mt. Sinai. The move will allow the Capital Improvement projects to take place, and the children to be in a safe location.

SUBJECT: Head Start and Early Head Start Eligibility for Children in Kinship Care

INFORMATION:

The Office of Head Start (OHS) has received questions from grantees who want to enroll children living in kinship care and are concerned about the eligibility of these children. Formal or informal kinship care, for the purposes of this IM, broadly refers to children who are living with relatives or caregivers other than their parents. In most cases, these children are eligible for Head Start services according to the Head Start Act and Head Start Program Performance Standards (HSPPS) and programs can enroll them. OHS encourages grantees to include children in kinship care in their enrollment and selection process.

The following descriptions provide grantees with information about ways children in kinship care can be eligible for Head Start.

Public Assistance

- Relative caregivers are often eligible for public assistance, such as Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI). If the caregiver receives or is eligible to receive public assistance, a child in their care is eligible for Head Start because they meet the definition of a family under HSPPS 45 CFR §1305.2.
- If the child living with relatives receives a "child-only" TANF grant, then the child receives public assistance. A child who receives or is eligible to receive public assistance is eligible for Head Start.

Foster Care

- Each state has jurisdiction of its child welfare system. OHS considers a child in foster care if the child is placed in a setting away from parents or guardians by the child welfare system and the state agency has placement and care responsibility (45 CFR §1305.2). A child is in foster care in accordance with this definition regardless of whether the foster care facility is licensed and payments are made by the state or local agency for the care of the child.
- If the child welfare agency has placed the child away from parents or guardians and in the care of relatives, the child is considered to be in foster care under the HSPPS. A child in foster care is eligible for Head Start.

Homeless

Head Start follows the definition of homeless child in the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance
Act (42 U.S.C. 11434a(2)). If a child is living with non-parent relatives due to loss of housing,
economic hardship, or a similar reason, the child may meet this definition of a homeless child.
A child experiencing homelessness is eligible for Head Start.

- Some examples of circumstances leading a child to kinship care include economic hardship, substance misuse, or incarceration. If the child is living with non-parent relatives for these or similar reasons, the child may be considered homeless and then would be eligible for Head

INFORMATION MEMORANDUM

TO: All Head Start and Early Head Start Agencies and Delegate Agencies

SUBJECT: Accounting Simplification for Head Start and Early Head Start Operations and Service Funds

INFORMATION:

This Information Memorandum (IM) is to inform grantees of a simplified accounting procedure that will go into effect beginning in fiscal year (FY) 2020. Currently, the Office of Head Start's (OHS) accounting structure includes two separate Common Accounting Numbers (CANs) for Head Start and Early Head Start operations. OHS will streamline the current structure by transitioning to the use of a single CAN for operations, inclusive of both Head Start and Early Head Start service funds. This change is meant to lessen administrative burdens grantees face when operating both programs. These CANs are known as Program Accounts 4122 and 4125 for Head Start and Early Head Start, respectively.

Starting in FY2020, all Head Start and Early Head Start operations amounts will be funded from CAN 4122. This change does not affect Program Accounts 4120 and 4121, the Head Start and Early Head Start training and technical assistance (T/TA) CANs, due to statutory requirements placed on those funds. This change only applies to traditional Head Start and Early Head Start grants and has no impact on Early Head Start-Child Care Partnership/Early Head Start Expansion grants. Furthermore, this accounting change does not affect annual funding and enrollment levels for Head Start or Early Head Start and does not change the processes for programs seeking to convert slots.

This accounting change is expected to relieve some of the administrative burdens grantees regularly face when operating both a Head Start and Early Head Start program. The existing structure forces grantees to allocate multiple shared costs between the two programs when

submitting budget estimates through the Head Start Enterprise System Grant Application Budget Instrument. Currently, when operations funds are awarded in separate CANs for Head Start and Early Head Start, there is no flexibility to make adjustments by moving funds between programs once an award has been issued without an ACF-approved budget modification. This simplified accounting procedure will alleviate that problem. It will also allow grantee requests for enrollment conversions from Head Start to Early Head Start—and in the case of American Indian and Alaska Native programs only, from Early Head Start to Head Start—to be implemented more timely due to the ability to reallocate funds between programs within the same CAN when needs arise.

This accounting structure change has no impact on how a grantee will continue to submit program-level funding requests or requests for conversion of slots, nor will it have an impact on the under-enrollment process. Funding guidance letters will continue to be provided with annual funding and enrollment levels for Head Start and Early Head Start along with instructions on how grantees will apply for funding.

Highlights of <u>GAO-19-519</u>, a report to the Republican Leader, Committee on Education and Labor, House of Representatives

Why GAO Did This Study

The Head Start program, overseen by OHS, seeks to promote school readiness by supporting comprehensive development of low-income children. In fiscal year 2019, Congress appropriated over \$10 billion for programs under the Head Start Act, to serve approximately 1 million children through about 1,600 Head Start grantees and their centers nationwide. This report discusses (1) what vulnerabilities GAO's covert tests identified in selected Head Start grantees' controls for program eligibility screening; (2) the extent to which OHS provides timely monitoring of grantees; and (3) what control vulnerabilities exist in OHS's methods for ensuring grantees provide services for all children and pregnant women they are funded to serve. GAO conducted 15 nongeneralizable covert tests at Head Start centers in metropolitan areas. GAO selected only centers that were underenrolled to be sure we did not displace any actual, eligible children. GAO also reviewed OHS timeliness goals and data for the period October 2015 through March 2018, and used attendance data to verify enrollment data reported for early 2018 for a nongeneralizable sample of nine grantees.

What GAO Recommends

GAO makes six recommendations, including that OHS perform a fraud risk assessment, develop a system to evaluate the effectiveness of its new workflows, and communicate guidance on when a student's slot should be considered vacant due to absenteeism. OHS concurred with four recommendations, but did not concur with two. GAO believes the recommendations remain valid.

Action Needed to Enhance Program Oversight and Mitigate Significant Fraud and Improper Payment Risks

What GAO Found

GAO's 15 covert tests at a nongeneralizable selection of Head Start grantee centers found vulnerabilities in centers' controls for eligibility screening and detecting potential fraud. Posing as fictitious families, GAO attempted to enroll children at selected Head Start centers in metropolitan areas (e.g., Los Angeles and Boston). For each test, GAO provided incomplete or potentially disqualifying information during the enrollment process, such as pay stubs that exceeded income requirements.

- In 7 of 15 covert tests, the Head Start centers correctly determined GAO's fictitious families were not eligible.
- In another 3 of 15 covert tests, GAO identified control vulnerabilities, as Head Start center staff encouraged GAO's fictitious families to attend without following all eligibility-verification requirements.
- In the remaining 5 of 15 covert tests, GAO found potential fraud. In 3 cases, documents GAO later retrieved from the Head Start centers showed that GAO's applications had been doctored to exclude income information GAO provided, which would have shown the fictitious family to be over-income. In 2 cases, Head Start center staff dismissed eligibility documentation GAO's fictitious family offered during the enrollment interview.

The Office of Head Start (OHS), within the Department of Health and Human Services, has not conducted a comprehensive fraud risk assessment of the Head Start program in accordance with leading practices. Such an assessment could help OHS better identify and address the fraud risk vulnerabilities GAO identified.

OHS has not always provided timely monitoring of grantees, leading to delays in ensuring grantee deficiencies are resolved. In the period GAO examined, OHS did not consistently meet each of its three timeliness goals for (1) notifying grantees of deficiencies identified during its monitoring reviews, (2) confirming grantee deficiencies were resolved, and (3) issuing a final follow-up report to the grantee. In October 2018, OHS implemented new guidance (called "workflows") that documents its process for notifying, following up, and issuing final reports on deficiencies identified by its monitoring reviews. However, OHS has not established a means to measure performance or evaluate the results of its new workflows to determine their effectiveness.

Vulnerabilities exist for ensuring grantees provide services to all children and pregnant women they are funded to serve. For example, OHS officials said grantees have the discretion to allow children with extended absences—sometimes of a month or more, according to GAO's analysis—to remain counted as enrolled. OHS officials told GAO that a child's slot should be considered vacant after 30 days of consecutive absences, but OHS has not provided that guidance to grantees. Without communicating such guidance to grantees, OHS may not be able to ensure slots that should be considered vacant are made available to children in need. Further, OHS risks paying grantees for services not actually delivered.

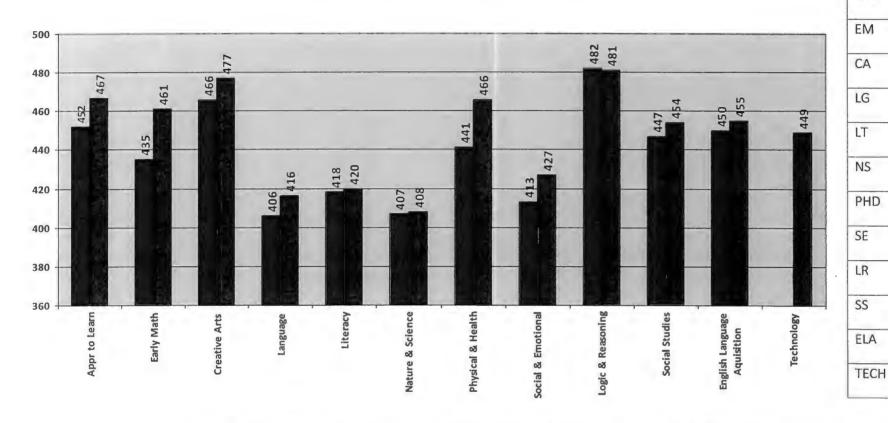

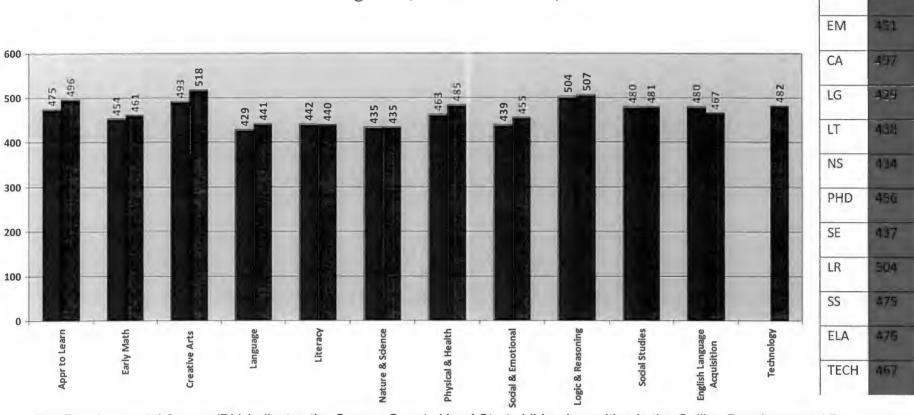

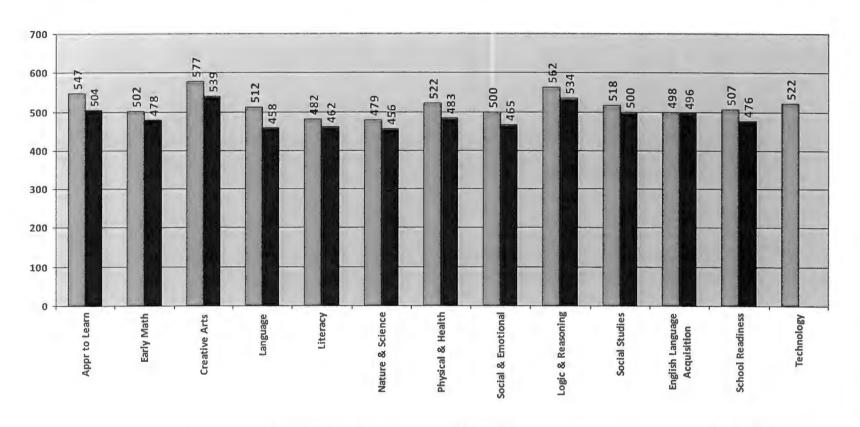


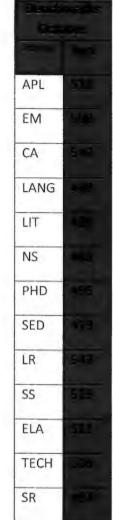

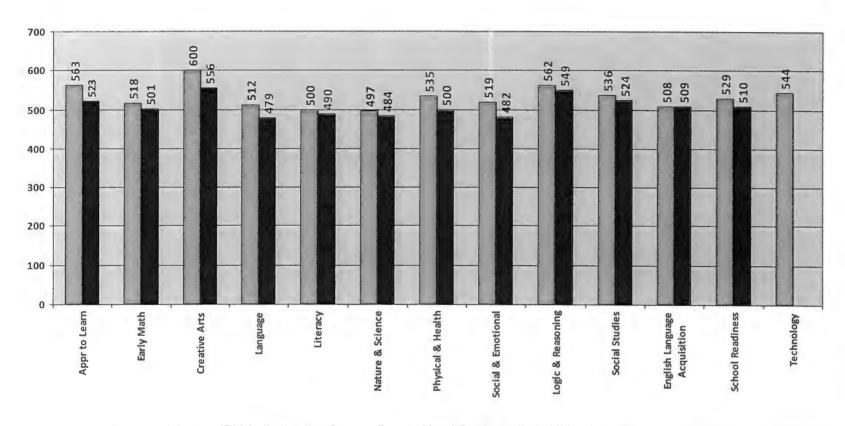
