Approval to award Invitation for Bids Y20-161-KB, Coarse Aggregate for the Orange County Utilities Department, to the low responsive and responsible bidder, Rockpack, Inc., in the estimated contract award amount of \$1,353,750 for a 5-year contract.

This contract will provide coarse aggregate to support highway construction and related work throughout the County.

### **REMARKS**:

Two bids were received in response to the Invitation for Bids and were evaluated for price reasonableness, responsiveness, and responsibility. The bid is considered reasonable based on comparison to the prior similar contract. The bid price is 1% less than the previous contract. Rockpack, Inc. meets the minimum requirements; therefore, is recommended for contract award.
