- SUBJECT: Award of Human Service Contracts for Children's Services, Y20-2000 Series for Fiscal Years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021

ACTION REQUESTED:

Approval to award Human Service Contracts for Children's Services, Y20-2000 Series for Fiscal Years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021, in the total amount of \$9,896,206 for a one-year term. Further request authorization for the Procurement Division to renew the contracts for two additional one-year terms.

PROCUREMENT:

The purpose of these contracts is to fund non-profit organizations that provide health and human services to children and families throughout Orange County.

FUNDING:

Funding is available in account numbers 0001-062-2556-8610 and 0001-062-0404-8610.

<u>APPROVAL</u>:

The Citizens' Commission for Children Division concurs with this recommendation.

REMARKS:

The Citizens' Review Panel for Human Services (CRP) is responsible for recommending the allocation of human service dollars to fund nonprofit programs in Orange County.

Award of Human Service Contracts for Children's Services, Y20-2000 Series for Fiscal Years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021.

During Fiscal Year 2017-2018, the Board commissioned the services of Forefront, LLC, an independent Florida-based consulting, research, and advisory firm, to provide recommendations for the utilization of \$20 million in new funding earmarked for children's programs and services in Orange County. Forefront, LLC published a final report outlining focus areas for targeted services of juvenile prevention and diversion, mental and physical health, early childhood education/care, and child/student homelessness. The report recommended that this programming should be provided in Orange County zip codes 32703, 32801, 32805, 32808, 32810, 32811, 32818, 32822, and 32839. Zip codes were divided into Targeted Community Initiative sectors as follows: Sector 1 - 32703; Sector 2 - 32801 and 32805; Sector 3 - 32808, 32810, 32811, and 32818; Sector 4 - 32822; and Sector 5 - 32839.

The allocation of the available funding occurred in three phases. Phase 1 of allocation amended currently contracted nonprofit organizations meeting contractual expectations. Phase 2 involved a competitive funding process facilitated by the CRP.

During Phase 3, funds were allocated using a mix of contract amendments and a competitive funding process. Finally, for Phase 3B, the CRP allocated rollover funding which remained in the budget due to the close of Fiscal Year 2018-2019 prior to the allocation of funding and funding not encumbered from other Community and Family Services divisions. Phase 3B allocated funding to nonprofit organizations who submitted applications in one or both of the prior two processes to address documented needs in additional zip codes in East and West Orange County based on data received from Forefront, LLC. In addition to the distribution of children's services funding during Phase 3 and 3B, the traditional CRP fund distribution process occurred simultaneously.

Prior to making funding recommendations, CRP members are provided orientation and training on the fund distribution process. This training includes, but is not limited to, evaluation of all facets of the funding proposal, such as budgets, program design, and review of organization documents comprised of bylaws, financial statements, Internal Revenue Services form 990, strategic plans, and other supporting documentation submitted by organizations. CRP members also received Results-Based Accountability training from Forefront, LLC prior to participating in the evaluation processes.

- Aspire Health Partners, Inc. will provide the following services:
 - Innovation Programming for Mental and Physical Health will provide an expansion of Orange County CAT (Community Action Team) to serve youth, ages 11 to 21 that are at-risk of out-of-home placement due to a mental health or co-occurring diagnosis repeated failures at less intensive levels of care, poor academic performance, and involvement with the Department of Juvenile Justice. Services offered are family-centered and culturally competent, focused around the strengths and needs of each youth and their family with a goal of developing skills and natural supports needed to sustain the youth in their family system and in the community.

- Innovation Programming for Youth Sectors 4 and 5 will provide evaluation, outpatient mental health counseling, and psychotherapy for children and adolescents with trauma, mental health, and/or co-occurring substance abuse disorders. Programming will target youth identified as at-risk of becoming or currently involved with the juvenile justice system due to elevated risk factors of parental or guardian incarceration to promote positive behaviors and interaction in the family and social environments, emphasizing the achievement of attainable goals including, but not limited to, increased academic success, reduction of involvement in delinquent or destructive behaviors, prevention or reduction of anti-social behaviors, and reduction of delinquent recidivism.

 - Youth Mentoring East and West Orange County will provide supervised, community approved mentoring activities for Orange County residents. - BIG SIS, Inc. will provide the following services:
 - Community Based Summer and School Break Programming West and East Orange County will be available during the day when school is not in session for Spring and Winter breaks and during summer vacation. Programming components shall have an emphasis on grade appropriate high-yield learning activities that promote academic skills such as reading, writing, math, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), English language proficiency, problemsolving, and critical thinking. Additional program services include service learning activities, health and nutrition, drug and violence prevention, etc. Programming should also include strategies to prevent the summer learning slide.

Programming shall have an emphasis on a mentoring component based on best practices, dedicated staff, and agency support to achieve successful program outcomes including, but not limited to, increase graduate success, prevention or reduction of antisocial behaviors, delinquent or destructive behaviors, and reduction of delinquent recidivism. The program shall also promote behaviors, attitudes, and outcomes for youth and reduce risk factors.

Program content will include, but not be limited to, home visitation, prenatal/postnatal parent education, and care coordination to help connect participants to available resources.

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- The Children's Home Society of Florida will provide the following services:
 - Early Literacy Programming East Orange County will offer services to students from birth to kindergarten to enhance the early language, literacy, and early reading development of preschool age children, particularly those from low-income families, through strategies and professional development that are based on scientifically based reading research. High-yield learning activities will promote the development of oral language, phonological awareness, print awareness, and alphabet knowledge. Programming should also encourage and reinforce the development of home learning habits critical for school success by creating a literacy rich home environment.
 - Group Parenting and Advocacy East Orange County will offer 0 parents or legal guardians of children birth to 18 years of age the opportunity to connect and support each other as they learn and practice new parenting skills through structured parent and parent-child Session content includes strategies for \ activities. effective communication. age-appropriate child development, behavior management, child safety, and injury prevention.
