Title: WATER QUALITY CAPITAL PROJECTS PRIORITIZATION

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#### I. POLICY

In order to improve water quality and maintain compliance with the state of Florida regulations governing surface water quality standards (<a href="Chapter\_62-302">Chapter\_62-302</a>, F.A.C. Florida Administrative Code), identification of impaired surface waters (<a href="Chapter\_62-303">Chapter\_62-303</a>, F.A.C. Florida Administrative Code), and Total Maximum Daily Loads (<a href="Chapter\_62-304">Chapter\_62-304</a>, F.A.C. Florida Administrative Code); Basin Management Action Plans (BMAPs); and the County's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit issued by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, it is the policy of Orange County, through Comprehensive Policy Plan Conservation Element Objective to monitor the waters of the county and implement—capital projects to address pollution sources. Priority of the projects is based on risk assessment of the waters of the county for further degradation in water quality and regulatory requirements. All projects will be evaluated using the best scientific information available.

### II. PROCEDURES

- A. The Environmental Protection Division (EPD) must evaluate all potential water quality-capital improvement projects for waterbodies identified annually using a ranking matrix that includes, at a minimum: risk of degradation, regulatory status, regulatory timeframes, external funding, cost-benefit analysis, and inter-agency partnerships.
- B. Projects identified outside the office of EPD shall be submitted to EPD prior to the next budget cycle to allow time for evaluation.
- C. EPD, through the annual budget process and approval, shall identify water quality eapital-improvement projects for submittal, which may include projects in any or all of the following phases:
  - <u>1.a.</u> Assessment: Waterbodies with declining water quality or at risk for declining water quality shall be studied to determine pollution sources. The assessment shall also identify potential projects that will mitigate pollution sources.
  - <u>2.b.</u> Feasibility Evaluation: Determine if projects can be built as identified in the assessment and the anticipated cost-benefit analysis.

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- 3.e. Design & Engineering: Develop engineered plans for construction.
- 4.d. Construction: Build and implement designed projects.
- <u>5.e.</u> Monitoring: Depending on the project, monitoring may be required to provide pollutant removal efficiency data.
- D. The Board of County Commissioners approves the list of water quality-eapital improvement projects through the annual budget process after considering input provided by the Office of Management and Budget, County Administration, and the Environmental Protection Division.
